Climbing great mountains with God

Acts 19:8-11, 23-29

1. Paul chose a “mountain” to climb (planting a church in Ephesus) that would be both challenging and glorifying to God.

Do you have similar personal mountains that you are looking to climb during 2007?

What mountains does your life group have to climb together during 2007?

2. Paul knew whether he was making progress by:

People coming to Christ (Acts 19:18, 20)

People being healed (Acts 19:11)

A broader effect on the surrounding community (Acts 19: 23-41)

What markers do you have for how your life group is doing in moving forward? How will you know if you are making progress?

3. What do you have to do in order to succeed?

Paul had worked out what he had to do to succeed:

Loving God (Acts 20: 18,31)

Building a caring community (Loving each other) (Acts 20:37)

Loving those who do not know Jesus yet (Acts 19:8)

Loving the nations (Acts 20:1-6)

What are the most important things for you to do to scale your mountain?

One of the most effective ways that we can love others is to ensure we invite them to things that we are doing. How is your life group doing at inviting people?

What can you do as a group to grow in this area?

4. Take some time to pray together that God will help you in the mountains you have to claim personally and as a life group together in 2007.
